More About Sistas Are Doin' It For Themselves

"SISTAS..." began twenty-five years ago as a call to the entertainment industry to acknowledge that there is grand talent amongst African American women filmmakers. What began as a simple screening and discussion became one of the most recognized inspirational and emulated events of the Black filmmaking community. It is a clear-cut concept: a screening of short films written and/or directed by some of the nation's top filmmakers with a dialog following. Past "Sista filmmakers" have included early works of Gina Prince - Bythewood (*Love & Basketball*), Kasi Lemmons (*Eve's Bayou*), Yvette Freeman (*ER*), and Dianne Houston (first Black female to be nominated for an Academy Award / Short Film category) just to name a very few. Many of these filmmakers have received high honors and recognition for their achievements and breakthroughs in filmmaking. Guests have a rare chance to have an open dialogue and hear the awe-inspiring stories of how these sistas did it for themselves.
